



February Guest Artist John Salminen







Washington National by John Salminen

John Salminen is our honored guest for February; John will be giving our first sold-out workshop of 2017, Realism through Design, February 13-17. This is his 3rd visit to CWA, but the first time we have had the realism workshop, as his previous workshops have been on abstraction.

Salminen will share his approach to painting the urban scene in watercolor, of which he is a master. In an interesting article by Paul Sullivan for Artist Daily, in his series Masters of American Watercolor, a Talk with John Salminen, he asks John how he became interested in watercolor.

"My interest in watercolor began in the early 1980s when I had an opportunity to study with Cheng Khee Chee. He was teaching extension classes at the University of Minnesota Duluth campus and a fellow art teacher and I signed up for several classes, spanning about a two-year time frame. This was not my first experience with watercolor but it was the impetus needed for me to make a serious commitment to the medium."

"I learned many useful techniques but most importantly I found the design-driven approach to watercolor intriguing and I became increasingly aware of the importance of a solidly developed design-based foundation. The more I painted the more I realized how much I had to learn. I feel that I am still building on information and skills I acquired during those classes."

Salminen began as an abstract expressionist painter and is still influenced by DeKooning and Franz Kline. When he began painting representational in watercolor, he wanted to paint like Cheng Khee Chee. (CWA was fortunate enough to have had Cheng Khee Chee give a workshop here some years ago, as well as have him as a member.) He was also cites the influence of the California painters, and he mentions Robert E. Wood, Morris Shubin, and Frank Webb as some of his influencers.

Salminen continues to be inspired by many other artists, citing Dean Mitchell's use of rich grays (Dean is our Silver Award winner in our 47th National Exhibition), Joseph Zbukvic's glowing middle-value passages (last year's workshop artist), and Mary Whyte's ability to engage the viewer on an emotional level (a previous workshop artist also).

Regarding his working style, John takes photos using the camera viewfinder as his sketchbook. He looks for value changes and an interesting composition. After he chooses a subject, he then works to infuse it with additional content that will speak to the viewers. To accomplish this he will add figures or alter "the mood and atmosphere by adjusting the value structure to impart a sense of time and place."

John is known for strong design and complex subjects. For years he did detailed drawings on location, then redoing the sketches with an eye toward design, composition and value. That drawing would then become his "blueprint" for the painting while the on-location sketch provided detail. Now after years of using this design-based approach creating patterns of value, dynamic arrangements of shape and interesting compositions, he can identify a strong subject both as he take the photos. Salminen admits to being a doodler, and he likes to make abstract arrangements of dark, medium and light values, which he calls composition at its most essential level.

"Once I see what I want to paint I do an extensive drawing, rearranging and redesigning just as I used to do in my sketchbook. The value of a solid drawing is that it frees me up during the painting process to concentrate on mood and feeling. Because my paintings are often quite large, the drawing keeps me in touch with my original intention and time spent creating the drawing is regained during the painting process. I have found that it's important for me to frequently put the painting up and look at it carefully and critically. The painting often develops its own voice and sometimes suggests a new direction."

With regard to using photos, John says his challenge is to create a work that is painterly and that enhances the reality of the scene. To do this, he adds elements that reflect his emotional reaction to the subjects, based on his experiences. "A photo faithfully records detail and I need to prioritize that detail, interpreting it and hopefully enhancing it. These things, combined with the quality of the mark on the page, distinguish a painting from a photograph."

John was honored with the status of Distinguished Master at the Transparent Watercolor Society of America awards dinner recently June after having been accepted into their exhibition 28 different years. The other four artists honored with this new designation are Dean Mitchell, Mark Mehaffey, Cheng Khee Chee and Kent Addison. John was awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award with Gold Medal from the Pearls of Peace International Watercolor Biennial in Pakistan.

John's painting "Paris Moods" received an Honorable Mention award in the Artist's Magazine 33rd Annual Art Competition in the Landscape Category. There were 1,371 entries in Landscape. His painting in the Portrait/Figure Category was a finalist. John's work has been on display in the Friends of Chen Xidan Watercolor Exhibition at the Shenzhen Arts Museum and in the First Jimo-Qingdao International Master Watercolor Exhibition China 2016.



John's work has been featured in over 80 articles in national and international magazines including The Artist, American Artist, Watercolor, Watercolor Artist, L'Art de L'Aquarelle, and the Chinese Watercolor Journal. He has also been featured in over 25 books, including: L'Art de L'Aquarelle – le Livre, The Chinese book Inspirations: Secrets from Contemporary International Watercolor Masters, Art Journey America, Landscape and the Russian book Masters of Watercolor.

John has a new book that just came out in 2016, John Salminen: Master

of the Urban Landscape, and it is available now through North Light Books, Amazon, Barnes and Noble and other book stores.

John has won more than 230 major awards in national and international exhibition, and is a signature member of numerous art societies, including the American Watercolor Society, The National Watercolor Society, the Watercolor USA



Honor Society, the Transparent Watercolor Society of America and Allied Artist. He is an honorary member of the Jiangsu Watercolor Research Institute in China and is the first American honored with inclusion in the Australian Watercolour Institute. John has been an invited artist in over 38 international watercolor exhibitions and in several small group exhibitions in Pakistan, Turkey, Canada, Greece, China, Taiwan, Thailand, Russia, Singapore, Mexico, Italy, Turkey, Belgium and Australia.

John has served as judge and/or juror of over 65 national and international exhibitions, including the American Watercolor Society, the National Watercolor Society, the International Watercolor Society and the Shenzhen Biennial. He was a Judge of Awards for the Annual Competition of the Artist's Magazine and Watercolor Magic.

Salminen earned his Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree from the University of Minnesota. He lives and works in Duluth, Minnesota. He teaches workshops, makes presentations and participates in painting events around the world. He is listed in Who's Who in American Art and Who's Who in America. He has released two instructional DVDs through Creative Catalyst Productions. John's work is included in many private, public and corporate collections of fine arts. He is represented by the Stremmel Gallery in Reno, Nevada.



Juror of Acceptance-Randall David Tipton, (www.randalldavidtipton.com), is a Northwest contemporary landscape painter, sometimes plein air, but mostly studio work from drawings, photos, hunches and memory, using an experimental approach. I spend a lot of time outside observing, taking in the mood of the day and noting my own reactions. I analyze my response; what is it about this landscape that is compelling? When I know, I try to paint just the image. Though I have a deep feeling for my subject, my intentions are aesthetic. A mood, memory, drawing or photo gets things started. Through the process, I hope to construct a work that has inherent interest and is in the spirit of the particular landscape.



Juror of Awards-John Finger, (www.fingerart.com), grew up in the San Francisco Bay Area's Diablo Valley. And graduated fro the California College of Arts and Crafts (CCA) in Oakland in 1977. He has traveled extensively around the World from Europe to Asia visiting art centers and collections, drawing from the works of the masters, and sketching and painting areas of interest and natural beauty. Although John is best known for his California landscapes, he continues to work on other studio and plein air paintings including the figure, still lifes and anything else that inspires painting. Currently, John exhibits, teaches classes, and holds workshops in Northern California.

Venue

The Delta Gallery, in the STREETS of Brentwood, 2485-Sandcreek #128, Brentwood, California, features the works of renowned artists of regional stature in painting, sculpture and conceptual art. The new owners have transformed and remodeled this facility into a beautiful open spaced gallery.

Eligibility

The CWA Regional Member Show is open to all CWA artists 18 years or older. Paintings must be two-dimensional and primarily water media on paper surface; Yupo and Tyvek are acceptable. Pastel or collage may be used as long as watermedia is the dominant element. No digital media, photography, prints, or reproductions. Source material and composition must be wholly original and not derived from any published images. Entries must be entirely the work of the artist, and not shown previously in a CWA Regional Member Show. No workshop or class work allowed. All paintings must be for sale.

Size Limits

Minimum image: 140 square inches, no side less than 10 inches. Maximum outside frame: 40"x40"

Framing

All paintings must be framed in simple, square-cornered frames ready for hanging and protected under Plexiglas with FOAM CORE BACKING, wire ends taped and ready to hang. **No sawtooths, clamps or eye screws.** Mats (optional) must be white or off white. Colored liner mats are acceptable. Additional details may be included in instructions to accepted artists.

Online Entries Only

All entries will be submitted via our website, www.californiawatercolor.org. Artists may enter up to three digital images in jpeg format, resolution 300 dpi, with 1200 pixels on the longest side, one painting per file. Show only the image without mat or frame.

CWA Members: Log in to the Members Home page, choose californiashows, confirm your information, and then add your painting details and upload your images.

Entry Fees (non-refundable)

Entry fee is payable on PayPal by credit, debit, or individual account. CWA members: \$20 for two images, \$30 for a maximum of 3 images.

Accepted Entries

All accepted artists will be notified by email and results will be posted online March 16, 2017. Accepted work must match submitted image; paintings not consistent with submitted image may be disqualified. **All paintings must have a label attached to the back.** Labels are found on the web at californiawatercolor.org >Membership >Forms> Labels for painting.

Sales

The Delta Art Gallery will retain a 30% commission. CWA will retain 10% commission.

Conditions and Liabilities

No work may be withdrawn before the end of the Show unless sold. CWA and the Delta Gallery reserve the right to photograph artwork or copy images for promotional purposes. Insurance coverage is the artist's sole responsibility, both in transit and during the show. Neither CWA nor the Delta Gallery insures the artwork and neither shall be responsible for loss or damage to any artwork submitted. Accepted artists must sign a release of liability. The submission of entries to this show shall constitute an agreement on the part of the artist to the terms and conditions as set forth in this prospectus.



William Tillyer: An Artist's Life

William Tillyer is an English painter and printer, who created a large body of work beginning in the mid twentieth century. Tillyer was born in 1938 in the community of Middlesborough in the United Kingdom. He studied art at Middlesborough College of Art from 1956-59 and moved to London to continue his studies at Slade school of Art in the 1960s. Tillyer began exhibiting nationally

and internationally by the 1970s. Large corporations, museums (including the Tate) and individuals, such as David Bowie, have purchased and collected his work. Tillyer shows his work at the

Bernard Jacobson Gallery and has been contributing to British art nationally and internationally for over four decades.

Tillyer paints landscapes that are very much in the tradition of English transparent watercolor landscapes; the feeling is one of an artless freshness. The paintings featured here are just one aspect of the artist's work. Tillyer is a painter and printmaker, and interested in many other forms of visual expression. I visited Tillyer's face book page (https://www.facebook.com/WilliamTillyer/) and found pictures of friends, family, and other artists. I also saw large constructions of acrylic paint on canvas and board and indications of the artist's interest in glass.

I reviewed Tillyer's work over several decades. More art can be viewed at the Bernard Jacobson Gallery at http://www.jacobsongallery.com and at http://www.artnet.com/artists/william-tillyer/. The paintings that meant the most to me were the watercolors.

The images I included in the column are recent and I think remarkable for color, composition and feeling. The broad washes of rich color are reminiscent of landscapes, but also remind me the beauty of landscape is present in my abstract understanding of the outdoors. I can enjoy and understand the references to landscape without seeing every leaf on every tree.
