"Art is either revolution or plagiarism" ( Gangian

I believe it can be very hard to paint a work that no one has EVER painted before unless you paint abstracts. I'm sure even with abstracts they can appear to be very similar to other artists work. But, there really is something in what Gauguin alludes to in this quote.

You can look at other work and it will create a spark. That spark drives your artistic thought process into high gear. What do I like about the other painting? What don't I like? How should I change it to make it mine all mine? I'm not thinking along the line of copying another artist's work and just changing up the colors or the size.

Look at the *Sleeping Venus* also known as *Dresden Venus.* It is attributed to Giorgione. He died in 1510 leaving this canvas unfinished. Venus is outside. There are no servants taking care of her needs. There are no animals present.

Now look at Titian's Venus of Urbino. Look familiar? Titian is credited with painting in the background of the Giorgione in 1534 as well as painting the Venus of Urbino. Interesting isn't it? Titian has brought Venus indoors. She has a couple of servants and look... she has a cute little lap dog sleeping on her bed. She's coyly glancing in your direction.

#### But wait!

Then comes Manet's Olympia in 1863. Model Victorine Meurent is the modern "Venus." You may be looking at her, but at the same time she is sizing you up. She's got a flower tucked behind her ear and she's toying with the mules on her feet. Her maidservant is showing her a bouquet of flowers someone, maybe you, has sent to her. She's not interested and her black cat really doesn't like you. Now, there is your revolution!

So, when looking for inspiration, think along Gauguin's thought process to produce your personal revolution!



As this show is in a hospital, we presented the award winners at our general meeting that evening.





## **Community Outreach**

## Oakland VA - Back to a Basic: Smooth Clean Washes

Our Oakland veterans have been painting with us for a number of years and some fine work has been created. Nevertheless, at their request, we've returned to basics and started with the color wash based on an unfamiliar source.

Kiyoshi Saito was a modern (post-World War II) Japanese woodblock artist whose intriguing work and flat color areas are perfect for practicing washes. Michael Friedland introduced his work to the group showing several examples. One was chosen, which we sketched and then began the color wash work.

#### Building blocks for washes:

- On the palette make a puddle of water large enough to cover the whole paper area you intend to paint, then mix the color by adding your pigments.
- Place the narrowest drawn wash passage at the top, turning the paper if necessary.
- Angle your paper toward you so gravity will pull your paint down the page.
- Fully load the brush and paint in one stroke across the top.

- Look for the bead at the base of each brushstroke indicating sufficient paint.
- Reload the brush from the paint mixture in the palette and paint again in one stroke overlapping the bead of the stroke above. Repeat till wash area is covered.
- Pick-up extra paint at the bottom of washed area with paper towel or thirsty brush.
- Allow to dry in position.

Some of the group found that they have the habit of returning the brush to the water between brush strokes creating a problem. Others found no bead at the bottom of the stroke indicating that the brush was too small or not fully loaded. Overall, completing Kiyoshi Saito's block print composition in watercolor gave the group excellent practice creating washes. They seem to be persuaded that using their 8" x 9" palettes to puddle the water and then bring in the pigment was a workable system. They accomplished painting some smooth flat even areas of color that made everyone happy and were introduced to the block prints of Kiyoshi Saito.
