

With each painting I try to achieve a quality of light that you can almost feel, clarity of color, strength of composition, and sense of spirituality, sometimes through my strong connection with my culture and sometimes with my quirky sense of humor.



I received my Bachelor of Fine Arts from St. Mary's College in Moraga, California and Master of Fine Arts in Drawing from College of the Arts in Oakland, CA. After creating with oils for several years as well as ceramics, pastel and textiles, discovering the quality of light and clarity of colors that could be achieved with watercolors changed the course of my artistic career and have worked with them for the past 28 years.

I have received numerous awards, including: Best of Show for the Society of Western Artists, many first, second, third and honorable mention awards with the California Watercolor Association, included in the American Watercolor Society, Transparent Watercolor Society, Northwest Watercolor Society as well as other Societies and the International Guild of Realism.

I have been an art instructor for the past 26 years as well as guest demonstrator for various art societies and conducted several watercolor workshops.

I was raised in both Mexican and American cultures; most of my images reflect my deep respect and connection to my Mexican/Native heritage.

We provide members with juried shows to display their talents. In 2019 we have scheduled four CWA member shows, attracting artists from around the country.

We are celebrating our 50th National Exhibition. Watermedia artists from around the world enter this exhibition. It will be held at Harrington Gallery at the Firehouse Arts Center in Pleasanton, California.

We offer a beautiful newsletter filled with art information and a wonderful website where, as a member, you can connect with other members and list your website for interested folks to see.

We produce several workshops per year with internationally known artists. Many of these artists are the general meeting guest artists.


So, what positions are we looking to fill on our board? I'm so glad you asked! We are looking for: Budget Director, Co-Communications Director, and Co-Member Shows Director.

Eligibility

This CWA Members Show is open to **ALL** CWA members 18 years or older.

Paintings must be two-dimensional and primarily watermedia on paper surface; Yupo, Tyvek and Aquabord are acceptable. Pastel or collage may be used as long as watermedia is the dominant medium. Digital media, photography, prints, or reproductions are not acceptable. The source material and composition of submitted work must be wholly original and not derived from any published images. Entries must be entirely the work of the artist, and **NOT shown previously in a CWA Members Show**. No workshop or class work allowed. All paintings must be for sale. All work submitted to this show must have been completed in the past two years. Subject matter that may be objectionable to the public (e.g., nudity, obscenity, and extreme political/religious views) will be disqualified.

Please NOTE the following sentence is being repeated as it has not been adhered to lately...

Entries must be **entirely** the work of the artist, **not** from a published image and **NOT shown previously in a CWA Members Show**. ••• Please re-read that last sentence!

- Artists that fail to provide the accepted entry will be disqualified from entering the next two CWA Member Shows.
- Paintings shown in a previous CWA Members Show will be disgualified from this show and from entering for two subsequent CWA Member Shows.

SHIPPED PAINTINGS FROM ALL REMOTE CALIFORNIA AND OUT-OF-STATE MEMBERS ARE WELCOME. See Accepted Entries section below for more details.

Online Entries Only

All entries will be submitted via our website, californiawatercolor.org. Members may enter up to three digital images in jpeg format, resolution 300 dpi, with 1200 pixels on the longest side, one painting per file. Show only the image without mat or frame.

Log in to the Members homepage, choose Shows/Exhibitions, then Member Shows and choose Quietude. Confirm your information, add your painting details and upload your images.

Entry Fees (non-refundable)

Entry fee is payable by PayPal, credit, debit, or individual account.

CWA Members: \$25 for two images, \$35 for a maximum of three images.

Accepted Entries

All accepted artists will be notified by email and results will be posted online September 7, 2019. Accepted work must match the submitted image; paintings not consistent with submitted image WILL be disqualified. The acceptance email will include all instructions for delivering the accepted painting(s) to the JMH Aspen Center in Walnut Creek. I (MF) signed a JMH Aspen Center Gallery loan agreement that is proxy for the CWA group loan agreement for this show.

Please note; delivery for this show is hand-carry for those close enough to the venue to do so. To clarify this, we want to open this show to our members in other states, as well as those who are located more remotely in California to where most of our Members Shows take place in the Bay Area. Think of it this way, IF you have been in a Members Show in the past several years, and hand carried your work to deliver to the show, please consider that you are required to do so for this show. Shipping of paintings for those in California, will be allowed for those who live south of San Jose, east of Sacramento, north of Santa Rosa and west of the Farallon Islands.

More details for shipping paintings will be in the acceptance letter. There will be a \$20 handling fee for shipped paintings.

Size Limits

Minimum image: 140 square inches, no side less than 10 inches. Maximum outside frame: 40 x 40 inches.

Framing

All paintings on paper, Yupo or Tyvek must be framed in simple, square-cornered frames ready for hanging and protected under acrylic (not glass). Frames MUST have a foam core backing, wire ends must be taped and should be ready to hang. No sawtooths, clamps or eye screws will be accepted. Mats (optional) must be white or off white. Colored liner mats are acceptable. Paintings on Aquabord (or other similar surfaced) cradled panels must be varnished or finished with a protective coating and may be displayed without an acrylic covering, but must still be framed in simple, square-cornered frames with wire (and D-rings) for hanging. Additional details may be included in instructions to accepted artists.

The following sentence is repeated for your convenience . . . Frames MUST have a foam core backing. It must show clearly that it is foam core when the painting is accepted at the show. IF you use the type of frame that has clasps that turn to close a hard board backer in place, the frame must have a brown paper dust cover glued to (over) the back of the frame. The masonite and hard board backing boards that come with many store-bought frames are not acceptable. The reason for this is that if someone buys a painting at one of our shows, we want them to get a product that will not discolor with age or affect the watercolor paper or surface.

Sales

All sales will be made through CWA. The show will include information about who to contact for those interested in purchasing a painting.

All paintings must remain for the duration of the show. JMH Aspen Center does not retain a commission on work that is sold at this gallery. They do gratefully accept a donation of \$3.00 per painting that is hung in the show. Please bring a check made out to JMH Walnut Creek Medical Center Auxiliary. These donations support development of the JMH Auxiliary initiatives at Walnut Creek Medical Center. CWA will retain a 10% commission on all work sold.

Conditions and Liabilities


No work may be withdrawn before the end of the Show. CWA and JMH Aspen Center reserve the right to photograph artwork or copy images for promotional purposes. JMH Aspen Center provides insurance for the artwork while it is in their possession. JMH Aspen Center insurance provides coverage for up to \$1500.00 per painting with a \$250.00 deductible. The submission of entries to this show shall constitute an agreement on the part of the artist to the terms and conditions as set forth in this prospectus.


Oakland VA - Get Well Art

The Oakland VA painting project for June was one of heart-felt intention. The project was to create cards conveying wellness, healing and recovery. A member of our Oakland VA group, Walter Seabock, had suffered a life threatening motorcycle accident. Walter has been a long time member of the group. Over the years he's shared many life episodes besides being a veteran of the Vietnam war.

To begin we talked about subjects that might bring comfort and symbols of regeneration and spiritual wellness. Nancy had brought some poetry books which we shared for inspirational words. Then every one just started in...the silence of deep concentration descended upon us.

The collage below shows the results. They were delivered by hand to Walter in the hospital. Happily Walter has improved greatly. He even made a visit to the Oakland group assisted by his lovely wife Stacey. He reflected, "When I was in the siege of Khe Sanh in Vietnam, I thought I would die every day." After the accident "they said I'd stopped breathing and they'd brought me back to life. Yeh! I'm glad to be alive. It wasn't my time... I don't know what's next, maybe I'll write a book."

We were all delighted to see Walter so positive and recovering so well. The art we created for health and wellness may have helped Walter turn a corner. It surely helped us show that we cared and were sending him art from our hearts.






