




# From the President

Minimum height = 3.5 inches Maximum height = 4.25 inches


I use my scrap watercolor paper and make the postcards 4 inches by 6 inches.

### **Eligibility**

This CWA Members Show is open to ALL CWA members 18 years or older, although only hand-delivered paintings can be accommodated for this show.

Paintings must be two-dimensional and primarily watermedia on paper surface; Yupo, Tyvek and Aquabord are acceptable. Pastel or collage may be used as long as watermedia is the dominant medium. Digital media, photography, prints, or reproductions are not acceptable. The source material and composition of submitted work must be wholly original and not derived from any published images. Entries must be entirely the work of the artist, done within the past two years, and **not shown previously in a CWA Members Show**. No workshop or class work allowed. All paintings must be for sale. All work submitted to this show must have been completed in the past two years. Subject matter that may be objectionable to the public (e.g., nudity, obscenity, and extreme political/religious views) will be disqualified.

- Artists that fail to provide the accepted entry will be disqualified for one year from entering a CWA Member Show.
- · Paintings shown in a previous CWA Members Show will be disqualified from this show and the member will be disqualified for one year from entering CWA Members Shows.

### **Online Entries Only**

All entries will be submitted via the CWA website, californiawatercolor.org. Members may enter up to three digital images in jpeg format, resolution 300 dpi, with 1200 pixels on the longest side, one painting per file. Show only the image without mat or frame.

Log in to the Members homepage, choose Shows/Exhibitions, then Member Shows and choose Summer Daze. Confirm your information, add the painting details and upload your images.

# **Entry Fees** (non-refundable)

Entry fee is payable by PayPal, credit, debit, or individual account.

CWA Members: \$25 for two images, \$35 for a maximum of three images.

# **Accepted Entries**

All accepted artists will be notified by email and results will be posted online Monday, June 1, 2020. Accepted work must match the submitted image; paintings not consistent with submitted image WILL be disqualified. The acceptance email will include all instructions for delivering the accepted painting(s) to LBD Gallery.

Please note; delivery for this show is hand-delivery only.

### **Size Limits**

Minimum image: 140 square inches, no side less than 10 inches. Maximum outside frame: 40 x 40 inches.

# **Framing**

All paintings on paper, Yupo or Tyvek must be framed in simple, square-cornered frames ready for hanging and protected under acrylic (not glass). Frames MUST have a foam core backing, wire ends be taped and should be ready to hang. No sawtooths, clamps or eye screws will be accepted. Mats (optional) must be white or off white. Colored liner mats are acceptable.

Paintings on Aguabord (or other similar surfaced) cradled panels, and varnished or finished with a protective coating, may be displayed without an acrylic covering, but must still be framed in simple, square-cornered frames with wire and D-rings for hanging. Additional details may be included in instructions to accepted artists.

The following sentence is repeated for your *convenience* . . . Frames **MUST** have a foam core backing. It must show clearly that it is foam core when the painting is accepted at the show. IF you use the type of frame that has clasps that turn to close a hard board backer in place, the frame must have a brown paper dust cover glued to (over) the back of the frame. The masonite and hard board backing boards that come with many store-bought frames are not acceptable. The reason for this is that if someone buys a painting at one of our shows, we want them to get a product that will not discolor with age or affect the watercolor paper or surface.

### Sales

All paintings must remain for the duration of the show. All sales will be handled by the exhibiting artists. There will be a 30% commission on all sales: 20% paid directly to the San Ramon Community Center and 10% paid to CWA.

### **Conditions and Liabilities**

No work may be withdrawn before the end of the show. Insurance coverage is solely the artist's responsibility, both in transit and during the Show. CWA and Lindsay Dirkx Brown Gallery reserve the right to photograph artwork or copy images for promotional purposes. Neither CWA nor Lindsay Dirkx Brown Gallery provide insurance for the artwork and neither shall be responsible for loss or damage to any artwork submitted. The submission of entries to this show shall constitute an agreement on the part of the artist to the terms and conditions as set forth in this prospectus.

# Just Add Rocks, Boulders & Water

Sky, land and trees have been the elements of our painting projects in the Oakland VA painting group for a number of months. The Oakland vets generally like the natural environment and Michael Friedland has always brought a new learning experience to each of these "paint along" projects. For March we added rocks or boulders to the landscapes and in some cases water. Michael brought some wonderful pencil and charcoal sketches as source material. The veterans were to create their own color schemes. We pondered the project and waited for George, who happened to be the last to arrive. Nancy had brought a beautiful surprise birthday cake for George's 70th. He made a wish, blew out the candles and we ate cake. Happy Birthday George! Then the group got to work.

We proceeded with some quick pencil sketches and everyone began to paint. In the conversation Michael explained how over time huge, jagged boulders become rounded stones as water falls pound and rivers erode them. Craig is our gold prospector. He explained that winter ice can sometimes break stones and that in times past some prospectors looked for gold by drilling holes in stones and letting winter ice crack them, thus revealing treasure, or not. In the meantime we all painted. Finally, when we shared our paintings the "take home" was that a greater value range would improve our work, but we happily observed that we each were developing a personal style.

# March at the VA Martinez

Twice a month CWA Outreach offers a dropin watercolor studio at the Veterans Clinic in Martinez, CA. We arrive early and set up with paint, paper and supplies. The room is inviting to artists and critics.

On this day, the doors were locked and the lights off, but Joe, one of our artists who was sitting nearby, instructed me to knock on the glass door. A staff member popped out of an inner office, recognized me and allowed me in. Others were there awaiting a meeting regarding the current situation. We all greeted each other with toe taps and elbow bumps. Others arrived. Subsequently we were informed that all outside [non VA staff] programs were cancelled for the time being, at least through the end of March.

In the hallway outside I saw an Army veteran who, again, told me his delightful story of hitchhiking from Germany to Paris and along the way meeting up with none other than Bob Hope in London who was there to judge a beauty contest. Mr. Hope had quipped "It's a tough job but someone has to do it!"

My friend then told me about the Irishman who was kicked out of the Army because he was a terrible marksman. His name was Rick O'Shay. One of the things I love about working with the military veterans is their sense of humor and espirit de corps. They are inclusive, celebrating both differences and similarities.

What I missed today was the friendly hellos and acknowledgements as I walked the hallway. It felt somber and apprehensive. As I told Joe before I left, maybe its better to engage in large measures to minimize the current situation's impact rather than suffer a much worse situation. As a military man, he understood.

One thing was quite clear. These are soldiers who know how to go into the unknown with courage and faith. We are all looking forward to meeting again and channeling our inner artists!





You will have a lot of help, believe me, everyone loves to enter shows!

Your board meets the first Tuesday of the month (except June and December) at the Ygnacio Valley Library, Walnut Creek from 7:00-9:00pm. Please reach out to me personally if you have any questions at: cahusslein@yahoo.com

### **Member Shows Position**

Position involved with member shows only (2-3 shows/year) and excludes national exhibition. At least two co-directors is advisable. Co-directors report to the Board and attend Board meetings.

# **Responsibilities of the Co-Directors:**

- Negotiate venues & dates for current and following years.
- Contact venue to finalize dates, times, security, etc.
- Secure a Show Chair or Co-chairs.
- Secure a juror/s.
- Provide information to Communications Director.
- Send announcement to newsletter.
- Write prospectus and send to Communications Director, newsletter editor and webmaster.
- Maintain files.

# Can be delegated to Show Chair:

- Announce show at general meeting and ask for volunteers.
