




Alameda County Fair Youth Awards

She inquired if CWA would consider making our awards using this format. CWA Community Outreach has happily accepted. This is the best way we can encourage these students to continue to create art.

We look forward to presenting the 2020 Alameda County Fair Youth Awards in our August newsletter. The paintings we present here are those of runners up from last year's Alameda County Fair youth exhibitions.





The Memory Project

Last year Community Outreach was fortunate to connect with and sponsor the Memory Project with the Art Club at John Swett High School in Crockett. The students did a terrific job painting the portraits of Pakistani students.

The project provides participating U.S. students with a photograph of a student from a different culture; for example, Bangladesh. The student's job is to create a portrait using the photograph (on paper, any media, and a specific size). These portraits and photos are sent back to the students by the Memory Project. A ceremony is held in the schools presenting the finished portraits to the students. They love receiving both the artworks and photos of themselves.

Based on this success, we've been hoping to expand the Memory Project to other high schools. Happily the Community Outreach committee has connected with Evan Hughes, the art teacher at Clayton Valley Charter High School, and he is interested! We've set a date to reconnect at the beginning of the coming school year. We are very pleased at the prospect of extending the Memory Project to another group of high school students.

In Memory of Joanne Corbaley

"Painting was her passion for the last nearly 29 years of her life." March 9, 1935-June 3, 2020


2020 SUMMER daze Lindsay Dirkx Brown Online Members Show




1st Place — Donner Lake by Robert Hamby

The artist has expertly composed this painting with a wonderful diversity of value, shape, line and color. The viewer is drawn into the scene with subtle distant mountains, water and sky. The foreground demonstrates strong values and variety in the arrangement of the trees, rock forms and atmosphere. While this painting has an amazing spontaneous feel, we all know that it is the result of deliberate brushwork and compositional arrangement.



2nd Place — Splat by Maureen Morley This is the most engaging pomegranate painting I have ever seen! The painting delights the viewer with an amazing variety in the application of the elements and principles of design, as well as technical expertise. The softness of the juicy splat contrasts with the hard edged colorful dominance in the seeds and structure of the broken fruit. The artist exhibits masterful proficiency in the spatial arrangement of the small, medium and large forms throughout the painting.



3rd Place — San Francisco Art Museum by Bingyu Pei

This painting draws the viewer into the scene with incredible detail, but much more. The painting demonstrates great variety in dominance established by light and dark contrasts as well as subtle treatment of values and soft edges in areas of rest. The color choices are luminous. The artist masterfully tells a story, making the viewer want to take a stroll through the scene.

Free Spirit by Kim Kearns

This portrait engages the viewer with an amazing arrangement of values and colors, as well as composition. The placement of the figure is wonderfully offset on the page, and the artist depicts the facial expression and precocious personality. The result is achieved by strategic balance of emphasis and simplicity. The eyes, glasses, facial features are wonderfully connected, and the composition is supported by soft connections and isolated background shapes.

A Dozen Roses by Samantha McNally

It is difficult to capture the true beauty of roses with paint and paper. This painting has excellent variety of shapes, values and colors, as well as the creative use of positive/ negative shapes and edge control. The composition and technical skill continually engages the viewer by keeping the eye moving through the painting.



Pajaro Pond by Salvador Valencia

This landscape offers great spontaneity with the diversity in color and values. It draws the viewer into the scene with its deceptively loose style, simplicity, and fresh application of paint. Most of us have great difficulty in exercising such restraint and, indeed, include too much extraneous detail.



Chance Encounter by Jane Sneed This painting is an intriguing collection of colors and values that tell a story of people in a sidewalk scene. It is simple and spontaneous, and engages the viewer with a minimal approach — the small shapes depict people with just enough detail. The colors are pure and the shapes delight the viewer like none other.


