## October ZOOM Demo Artist David Savellano, MCWA

This will be a **ZOOM Paint Along** for CWA members to participate at no charge, on Wednesday, October 21, from 7:00–9:00 pm. The **ZOOM Meeting ID**, material list and reference photos for the paint along subject will be emailed to CWA members approximately two weeks prior to the demo. The format will be David painting, with participants sketching along.



Given the COVID-19 pandemic, are you dreaming of traveling in the future? Well, you can still safely practice travel sketching techniques. Want to enrich your travel experiences and combine your travels with your artistic endeavors? Then you will want to participate in this ZOOM sketching session by featured artist David Savellano, Juror of Awards for the CWA 51st National Exhibition.

Travel Sketching enables you to record your unique and personal insights. You will come away with an enduring recall of your travels, remembering details and experiences distinctively your own. Although your sketching time may be limited, you can execute the drawing and then complete the watercolor washes at a later time. Sketchbooks are compact and accessible when that artistic inspiration hits you. As an added bonus, your sketches can be the basis for larger and more detailed art work.

David's demonstration will review the ins and outs of the plein air (outdoors) sketching experience, and basic techniques of ink and watercolor sketches. He will discuss the key questions to ask yourself before you put ink or a brush to the paper. Over the years, David has developed a quick, fresh, loose watercolor style which lends itself well to the time

### Memory Project Portraits Created by the Art Club of John Sweet High School











Community Outreach committee has been offering to sponsor high school students in the Memory Project. The Memory Project connects developing nation students with U.S. students through art, specifically portraits. The project furnishes the U.S. students with photos of developing nation students from which they create 2D portraits. The Art Club of John Sweet High School participated in this project last year with impressive results.

This year Community Outreach offered to sponsor students at Clayton Valley Charter High School. Then we learned that all classes there are virtual, via computer, and that the students are working at home with the materials they have there. Yet we are thrilled to report that despite these difficulties a number of students are planning to do the Memory Project. Fortunately CWA has been able to offer these students some supplies thanks to the generous donation of quality paper from Helena Katz and Gerald Lester. Furthermore, the Clayton Valley students were invited to share the Michael Holter general meeting demonstration on September 16.

As the pandemic is worldwide it is likely that the developing nation students whose portraits will be created are also being impacted. Sponsoring this program is bridge building, a way of greeting them and wishing them well. Community Outreach will continue to contact schools and offer their students the opportunity to participate in the Memory Project.







constraints of traveling. He is eager to share his personal knowledge gained after self study, weekly life drawing and numerous watercolor and drawing classes and workshops.

#### Hello fellow CWA members,

Yes, it's that time again. I never get tired of asking you to volunteer to be a board member!

We are asking you to step up and become a member of the CWA board. What is new this year is that we are running our meetings on ZOOM!

It is not nearly as fun as meeting in person, however it is easier than driving to a meeting when it's dark, raining or a high traffic time. Please keep this in mind when considering joining the board.

#### Positions open right now:

**Vice President/Membership** (position can be shared) **Communications Director** (position can be shared) Member At Large (Two positions open)

#### Position open 2021:

**President** (position can be shared)

Yes, it is time for me to retire. After three years as Program Director and six years as President it is time to step down and welcome others to the position. I will be working on various items for the board but I will not be on the board. I will assist in any way I can for 2021.

#### Here are brief descriptions of the positions:

Vice President/Membership: The Vice President shall manage the membership processes of recruitment, record membership, new member orientation, and shall oversee management of petition(s) for signature membership(s). The Vice President shall be responsible for duties or special projects as may be prescribed by the President and/or CWA Board of Directors. In the absence or disability of the President, the Vice President shall perform all duties of the President; shall have signature powers over the financial accounts along with the Budget Director, which shall have the same validity and binding effect as if done by the President. The Vice President shall act as Board Liaison to the Data Manager.

**Communications Director:** The Communications Director shall work with the board to publicize CWA and its activities, including contacting other arts groups and news organizations as requested by a board member or appointed Committee Chair. The Communications Director shall manage the publishing of the Newsletter and the actions of the webmaster. The Communications Director shall be the designated board member to receive all inquiries sent to the email address noted at the start of the Policies and Procedures document and to then pass said inquiries to the proper Board, committee, or staff person.

Members At Large: The two members at-large will have no assigned programs. They will provide assistance to the Board on special assignments, will learn the Boards' functions, and will serve as liaison between the Board and the general membership.

**President:** The President shall supervise the Association's activities and put into effect the decisions of the Board. The President shall preside, at meetings of the Association both general and Board; appoint chairman and members of all Committees except where otherwise stated; sign all written contracts or obligations of the Association subject to Board approval; shall function as ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee; make a report at the November general meeting of the progress of the Association during the past year with recommendations for the coming year; shall appoint a qualified person to review the annual accounting processes once per year; shall have signature authority over the financial accounts along with the Budget Director; shall be responsible for seeing that the Bylaws and Policies of the Association are carried out; and, may have such other powers and duties as the Bylaws may direct; shall carry out the duties of the office in such a way as to promote the effective operation of the Association.






