Persevering through Seasons of Drought

As one progresses in their creative journey, it is not uncommon to encounter seasons of dryness. "Drought," author Julia Cameron calls it in *The Artist's Way*. It is not something that affects watercolorists specifically but is an experience well documented by artists in general, including writers, as well as those that work in the performing arts. What once ignited our souls seems to have waned, and we are left with a lack of inspiration. Such is the ebb and flow of the creative spirit.

At first, the lack of inspiration may be disturbing. We may fear that we have come to the end of our creative selves and that we shall never receive from our divine muses again. But more seasoned artists know that it is simply part of the terrain. Droughts come and go, as do the reprieves of the welcome rain. Unless we are of the exceptional lot that never experiences such occurrences, we need to accept drought as part of the creative process.

The question then arises, as to what we ought to do in the times when we are waiting to feel inspired again. For one thing, we must learn to be still and to accept each moment for what it is and what it brings. Fighting our lack of inspiration will not hasten its return but will rather just leave us frustrated. No, we must be patient and weather through the season of dryness, while being proactive in other ways.

In my own experience, I have found that it is beneficial to spend time in the outdoors. Begin taking walks or hikes and really allow yourself to be aware of your surroundings. Listen for the birds, really notice the colors of the flowers and the trees. Just being out of doors may sometimes be enough

to bring new inspiration. Take a sketchbook with you and capture some of what you see, being willing to make the visual documentation of the experience, thus creating a type of diary of time well spent.

Secondly, switch things up a bit. Try something new and different. Find an artist that approaches the medium in a very different way. Are you a tight painter? Take a look at some of Jean Haines' books which encourage a loose, free-flowing technique with lots of water and soft edges. Allow yourself to reach outside of your box. Don't keep doing things as you have been used to doing them. Pick up a new medium. Play around and have fun with something that you are not as familiar with. Be willing to allow yourself to be a beginner, knowing that making mistakes is part of the learning process. In so doing, you will discover that there are innumerable ways in which one can express creativity and will most likely return to your medium of choice with greater clarity.

Lastly, if you are not already doing so, develop the habit of journaling. *The Artist's Way* advocates for daily journaling, requiring a minimum of three pages of writing every day. This can be as simple as listing things that bring you joy, developing a gratitude list, or recording your train of thought as you consider your obligations. Some would insist that it is this very discipline that will carry you through the times of drought and bring value to the time in which you are waiting.



Saturday, April 16, 2022, 11:00 am to 2:30 pm







The Borges family home, built in 1901, houses historical displays of the early 1900s. It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Meet at 11:00 am in the parking lot at the first picnic area and we'll decide where to meet for lunch and critique at 2:30 pm, probably in the shady picnic area. Park in designated areas; restrooms available; bring water and lunch.




