Carolyn Lord gallery talk at the 52nd National Exhibition

Callas and Stucco by Carolyn Lord

Carolyn Lord gave a gallery talk at the 52nd National Exhibition in February of 2022. It was so full of thoughtful insights and probing analysis of some of the paintings, in addition to a wealth of other interesting information, that we invited her to speak at our October General Meeting to give us a repeat performance.

In addition to reviewing and critiquing a number of the paintings from the exhibition, Carolyn will discuss the importance of values in structuring effective compositions and show examples of the use of values in works from Rembrandt to Rothko and other masterworks. Additionally, she will show those same insights and concepts in paintings that were in the exhibition, discuss how those concepts apply across the board in all painting, including what a juror looks for in jurying an exhibition.

You'll definitely want to hear Carolyn's thoughts and observations in this presentation on October 19, from 7:00 to 9:00 pm.



# The Drawing Board

# Why is that called blue? Why do we say that?

s painters, we look at and think about colors and use their various names every day. An interesting exercise can be to take a step back from red, yellow and blue, etc., and think about how we even came to use the words that we do for colors. How is it that we use these sounds (words) to name these things?

The first thing we need to do is to look at how Western language (that eventually gave us the language that we speak) developed. As languages developed over the centuries and around the world, those that eventually gave us Modern English are broken down into three main periods of development.

Yellow This color initially was called *ghel*, then later it was *gelwaz*, then *gel* in Old Norse and *gel*, Old High German and in Old English was *geolu* or *geolwe*.

The parents of Modern English Proto-Indo-European 4th millennium BC

Considered the ancestor of Indo-European language.

Proto-Germanic 2000 to 500 BC

Languages like Saxon, Norse, Icelandic, Gothic and Vandalic, along with early German and English took shape during that time. Old English 400 to 1100 AD

An early form of today's English developed.

**Blue** This color started as *bhle*, then became *blaewaz*, in Old English it was *blaw*. Red Initially this color was *reudh* and meant ruddy. In the second wave of language development, it was *rauthaz* or *raider* in Old Norse and *rod* in Old Saxon. In Old English it was *read*.

**Green** This was first called *ghre*, later *grene*, then *grene* in Old Norse and *grown* in Dutch. In Old English, it was *grene* again and meant young and immature.

Orange Which came first, the color or the fruit? It was the fruit! The Sanskrit word for the fruit of the tree that bore it was *Naranga*. This became in Arabic and Persian *Naranj*, then in Old French *pomme d'orenge*. (Pomme is the French word for apple).

**Purple** This word didn't appear until late in the development of language, the 9th century AD. *Purpul* was borrowed from the Latin word *purpura*. The Romans made the color Tyrian Purple from a type of sea snail, the Murex. For a time, only the Roman Emperor was near bits of the solar.



Black This color, no surprise, derives from the idea of things that were burnt or that are dark. In the parietal paintings at Lascaux and other places, the black areas were painted with burnt sticks or charcoal. Initially this was called *bhleg*, which became *blakkaz*, then *blacken* in Dutch and then *bleak* in Old English. And today, when a situation is 'bleak', that's pretty dark.

**Pink** This is one of the most recent color names. In the 1700s, pink was used to describe the flower petals of the Dianthus plant. So, what did Barbie do for all those years before that?!

The August gathering of the veterans at the Oakland Veterans Center felt like a visit to Yosemite because the group painted Cook's Meadow with a pine forest behind and topped with the granite peak of Half Dome. Michael Friedland provided us with the photo he took while teaching watercolor there in July. It's a great shot and perfect for our lesson on working washes in three simple shapes.

Michael began the class with a review of painting washes in irregular shapes. He then went on with mixing lighter to darker shades of color by building up water puddles with enough pigment to hold the consistency of tea, milk, cream, or yogurt. Using a tea consistency to paint the lightest wash, followed by milk for a fuller color, then cream for an even fuller color, and finally yogurt for the darkest color marks.

We began our paintings by sketching the horizon line and those few lines we needed for the big shapes. Starting with the sky, Michael led us through the "paint along" moving top to bottom, wet into wet. Along the way, the vets, being the vets, moved into their own interpretations of this fabulous landscape. The huge granite mountains, clouds, pine grove,

and meadow gave us quite a challenge. Some of us got a good start on this painting during class time. Others accomplished a completed painting in the class. Michael's completed painting was very striking with a classic lightdark-light composition.

When we concluded the class we shared our work and some snacks provided by the Veterans Center. We socialized and comments were made on Rudy's great cloudy sky, Michael's chartreuse meadow, and Nancy's castle perched on the mountaintop — plenty of artistic license at play here. A good number of us left planning to work, maybe finish, our paintings at home. Studying the natural wonders of Yosemite made a delightful painting day for CWA volunteers and the veterans.
